



**Awards and Grants Program**  
of the  
Editorial Council of the *Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry*

### **Objective**

In keeping with our mission to provide a means for the interchange of ideas reflecting the complete scope of clinical practice in fixed, removable and implant prosthodontics, maxillofacial prosthetics, restorative dentistry and dental technology, the Editorial Council of *The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry*, through its Awards and Grants program, makes funds available to eligible organizations. These funds are awarded to support activities that foster manuscript publication in *The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry* or enhance communication and cooperation among dental communities through the World Wide Web.

### **Funding Criteria**

Proposals for funding submitted to the Editorial Council should be designed to:

1. Satisfy the priorities of the Editorial Council;
2. Further the goals and missions of *The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry*;
3. Expand and disseminate the body of knowledge in prosthodontic research, education and patient services, or improve the health care and well-being of the public;
4. Promote *The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry* nationally and internationally;
5. Acknowledge excellence in advancing the discipline of prosthetic dentistry.

### **Funding Priorities**

Activities under the auspices of Founding or Sponsoring Organizations that promote the following missions will be considered:

1. Add to the body of knowledge in prosthodontics, and distribute this information to the academic and practicing communities;
2. Assist dental and prosthodontic organizations in the advancement of the specialty and discipline of prosthodontics;
3. Improve communication within professional organizations through their website;
4. Honor exceptional individuals for scholarly contributions or with Life Achievement Awards in the dental/prosthodontic field;
5. Support graduate student research competitions (oral presentations and/or poster presentations).

### **Special Projects**

1. The preparation, publication and distribution of manuscripts that will expand the body of knowledge in prosthodontics for the professional and/or the lay public;
2. Facilitate communication among, and distribution of information to dental communities through the World Wide Web; or
3. Directly aid dental healthcare and awareness within the public sector.

### **Funding Limits/Limitations**

1. Awards will be granted up to \$4500 per year to support any of the activities listed above.
2. Grants will not be provided to sponsoring organizations to improve their individual websites.
3. Grants will not be provided to support travel, audiovisual needs, social events or registration fees.

Sponsoring organizations receiving Grants/Awards will require that the organizations include a statement from the podium at the time of rendering the awards that these funds have been allocated through an educational grant from the Editorial Council of the Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry.

### **Protocol for Application Review**

Applications for funding will be reviewed by the Awards and Grants Committee. Members of the committee will rank the applications on a scale of 1 to 5 using the funding criteria and priority statements above to establish a priority score. The committee may, during the review of the proposal, request the assistance of external consultants with expertise in the subject of the application. Statements of the quality, significance and contributions of the funding request to the mission statement of the *Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry* and to prosthodontics in general, and the appropriateness of the budget for each will be presented in the form of a report prepared by the committee. The chair of the Editorial Council will receive the report and submit its recommendations to the members of the Editorial Council at its annual meeting. The members of the Council will review the report and recommendations by the Awards and Grants Committees as a basis for approval or rejection. All approved applications will be funded based on availability of funds. Applications need to be received by December 1 or July 1 in preparation for a decision by the Editorial Council of The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry which meets in January and August.
